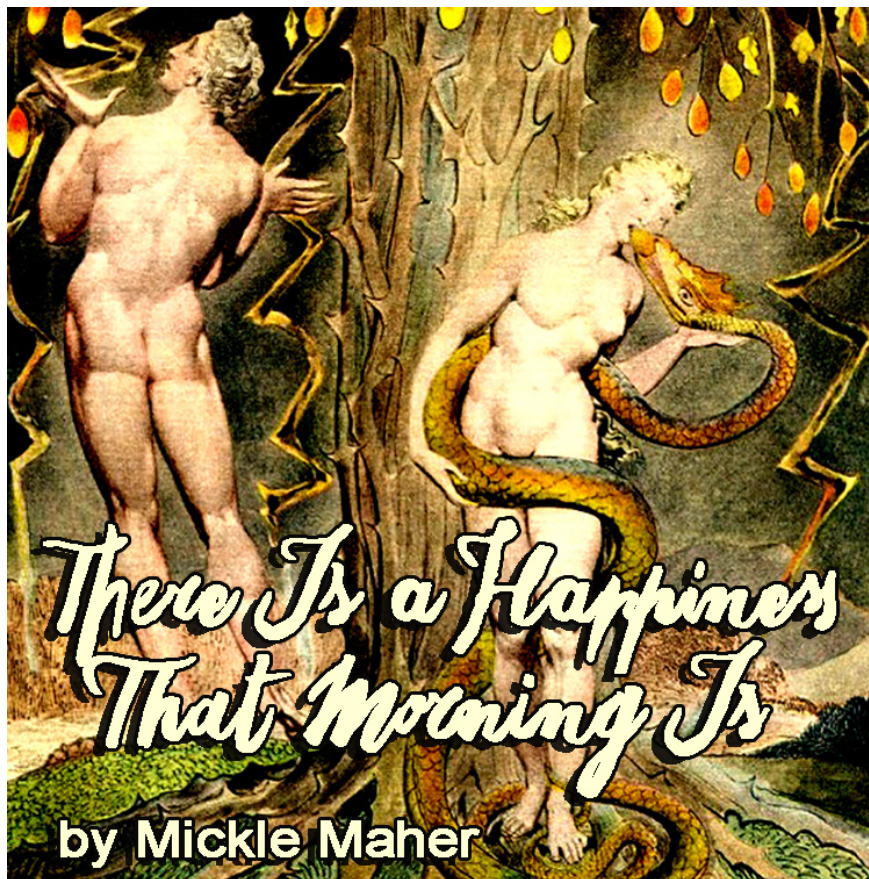

## **Academia Runs Amok in Bridge Street's "There is a Happiness That Morning Is"**

An inappropriately public display of affection upends the lives of two William Blake scholars in Mickie Maher's raucous celebration of art, ardor, and academia "There is a Happiness That Morning Is", coming to Catskill's Bridge Street Theatre for eight performances only, Thursdays through Sundays from September 6 - 16, 2018.

For nearly twenty years, two professors at a crumbling Liberal Arts College in rural New England have been carrying on a clandestine love affair while simultaneously lecturing on the poetry of William Blake – he on 'Songs of Innocence', she on 'Songs of Experience'. But their classes today are going to be particularly challenging. Last night while conducting an impromptu fresco lecture on the college quad, the pair became so carried away while reading Blake aloud that they threw off their clothes and made mad, passionate love in full view of all their students as well as the school's puritanical president. Now, desperate to salvage both their careers and their love, they must convince a scandalized campus community that this 'public showing' of their 'dew-dipped thighs' was the apotheosis of Blakean ecstasy or else suffer the consequences. Oh, and did we mention that the play is written, like Blake's poems, almost entirely in rhymed couplets? This is one set of lectures no student (or audience) in their right mind would want to miss.

Bridge Street Theatre's production of this word-drunk romp features Molly Parker Myers as Professor Ellen Parker, Brian Petti as Professor Bernard Barrow, and Steven Patterson as President Dean. The play is directed and designed by Bridge Street Theatre Artistic Director John Sowle and features a song composed especially for this production by Catskill's Frank Cuthbert.

"There is a Happiness That Morning is" will be presented Thursdays-Saturdays at 7:30pm and Sundays at 2:00pm from September 6-16 on the Bridge Street Theatre Mainstage, located at 44 West Bridge Street in the Village of Catskill, NY. The Thursday September 6th preview and the Sunday September 9th matinee are both "Pay-What-You-Will" performances ("Pay-What-You-Will" tickets are available only at the door prior to the performance and are subject to availability). **BRIAN PETTI** (*Bernard*) is a Hudson Valley-based playwright and actor. His *Echoes of Ireland* had the distinction of being the first play ever staged at Bridge Street Theatre. Acting credits include Septimus in *Arcadia* (Rhinebeck Theatre Society), McMurphy in *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest* (Curtain Call Theatre), and Jack in *The Importance of Being Earnest* (Creative Theatre). Brian is overjoyed to be working with John and Steven, in the theater they built out of whole cloth.

**MOLLY PARKER MYERS** (*Ellen*) returns to Bridge Street Theatre after last season's *Redwood Curtain*. Other work with BST and Kaliyuga Arts includes *Lucky Lindy*, *Lark Eden*, *The Mound Builders*, *True Love Lies*, and *Kill Me Now*. Recent regional credits include *Emilie: La Marquise du Chatelet Defends Her Life Tonight* and *The House of Blue Leaves* (Wellesley Rep), *The Graduate*, *The Norman Conquests Trilogy*, *Lost in Yonkers*, and *Talley's Folly* (Winnepesaukee Playhouse), *Yours*, *Anne* (Half Moon Theatre) and *Constellations* (Tangent Theatre). **STEVEN PATTERSON\*** (*President Dean*) is co-founder and an Associate Artist of Bridge Street Theatre. He has performed both Off- and Off-Off-Broadway in NYC, and regionally with such theaters as Kaliyuga Arts (which he founded with his husband, John Sowle, in 1986), South Coast Repertory, Capital Repertory, TheatreWorks, Lexington Conservatory Theatre, Chenango River Theatre, Centenary Stage Company, and the Oregon, Orlando, Colorado, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Utah, Lake Tahoe, and Richmond Shakespeare Festivals. A few of his favorite roles have been King Lear, Jake Sturdy in *Kill Me Now*, Austin Wiggin in *The Shaggs: Philosophy of the World*, David in *Poor Super Man*, Judi Boswell in *How to Pray*, and Jean in *Beauty*, a one-man show inspired by the life and works of Jean Genet which he created, performed, and toured with internationally for four years. He currently resides in Catskill, NY.

### **The Production Team:**

**MICKLE MAHER** (*Playwright*) is a cofounder of Theater Oobleck and the author of numerous plays, including *There is a Happiness That Morning Is*, *An Apology for the Course and Outcome of Certain Events Delivered by Doctor John Faustus on This His Final Evening*, *The Hunchback Variations*, *The Strangerer*, *Spirits to Enforce*, *The Cabinet*, *Lady Madeline*, and *An Actor Prepares* (an adaptation of Stanislavsky's seminal book). His plays have appeared off-Broadway and in theaters around the world, and have been supported by grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, the Rockefeller Foundation Multi-Arts Production Fund and Creative Capital. He currently teaches play writing and related subjects at the University of Chicago and Columbia College.

**JOHN SOWLE** (*Director/Designer*) is Artistic and Managing Director of Bridge Street Theatre. He founded Kaliyuga Arts in 1986 with his partner Steven Patterson and has received multiple awards for his directing and design work on their Los Angeles, San Francisco and New York productions. He has directed and designed BST's productions of *Leni*, *Redwood Curtain*, *How to Pray*, *The Official Adventures of Kieron and Jade*, *Frankenstein: The Modern Prometheus*, *Holiday Memories*, *The Epic of Gilgamesh*, *The Killing & The Love Death* (late plays of William Inge), and *Grinder's Stand* by Oakley Hall III, and designed their productions of *The Tavern*, *The Effect of Gamma Rays on Man-in-the-Moon Marigolds*, and *Frankie & Johnny in the Clair de Lune*. John has an undergraduate degree in mathematics from M.I.T and a PhD in Dramatic Art from UC Berkeley.
